Key Word	Definition
Birth Rate	The number of live births per 1,000 people per year
Standard of Living	How well-off a person or country is
Migration	The movement of people from one place to another to live or work
Shanty settlement	A collection of poor quality housing, often lacking electricity, water and sewage
Pastoralist	A farmer who looks after herds or flocks of animals
Developing country	A country that is often quite poor and has a low standard of living
Gross National Product	A measure of the wealth of a country.
Rift valley	A deep, steep-sided valley, formed by the sinking of the land between two surface cracks or faults
