Key Word	Definition
Development	Involves changes that usually bring improvement and growth.
Life expectancy	The average number of years a person born at a given time can expect to live.
Quality of life	A measure of how content people are with their lives and with the environment in which they live.
Overpopulated	When there are more people living in an area than that area can support.
Raw materials	Natural resources that are used to make things e.g coal and trees
Import	Goods brought by a country that produced in other countries.
Export	Goods produced in one country and sold in other countries.
Manufactured Goods	Secondary industry products such as cars, computers and electrical items.
